Gilbert, 20th-century geographer who gained the nickname 'Father of Floodplain Management' and once said "Floods are an act of God, but flood losses are largely an act of man."

Clue 3 (for 8 points)

Peregrine, the first child born to the Pilgrims who arrived in America aboard The Mayflower.

Clue 4 (for 7 points)

Carrie, the titular character of the Steven King book and movie Carrie.

Clue 5 (for 6 points)

Katie, English singer in the band The Ting Tings.

Clue 6 (for 5 points)

Elwyn Brooks, American author of Stuart Little and Charlotte's Web.

<u>Clue 7</u> (for 4 points)

Betty, American actress known for playing Rose on The Golden Girls and Sue Ann on the Mary Tyler Moore Show.

Clue 8 (for 3 points)

Walter, the protagonist on the show Breaking Bad, as played by Bryan Cranston.

Clue 9 (for 2 points)

Jimmy, often regarded as the best snooker player to have never won the World Championship, having lost in the final six times

Clue 10 (for 1 point)

Barry, singer known as The Walrus of Love who hits included "Can't Get Enough of Your Love, Babe" and "You're the First, the Last, My Everything".
